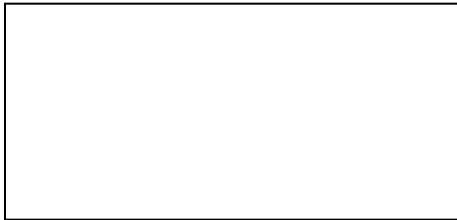


LENTEN STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Many of you know of the loss our community suffered with the passing of Devin Reid in January. As I thought about what to share with you in this edition, I could not help but remember the quote by Steve Prefontaine that Devin used throughout his life:

"To give anything less than your best is to sacrifice the gift."

There is rarely a day that goes by that we do not recall fond memories of Devin. He taught us through his example that we should live to our potential and push a little more even when we are exhausted. I was asked to the eulogy at Devin's funeral and was very humbled to do so. The following is the closing: Three years ago when the announcement came about Devin's diagnosis, our school community prayed the Serenity Prayer for him. The prayer embodies all he has shown us and encouraged us to do. I would like to share this prayer with you now:

God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change;
courage to change the things I can;
and wisdom to know the difference.

Few of us pray (or we may not even know) the rest of this prayer, but it states better than I ever could how Devin lived his life, and how the Lord is always at our side. The Serenity Prayer continues with:

Living one day at a time;
Enjoying one moment at a time;
Accepting hardships as the pathway to peace;
Taking, as He did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it;
Trusting that He will make all things right if I surrender to His Will;
That I may be reasonably happy in this life
and supremely happy with Him forever in the next.
Amen.

As I wish you a restful summer, I would like to take a moment to thank our students, teachers, staff, parents, board members, and all who contribute to the success of our community, including our many benefactors and patrons. We are blessed with dedicated and hardworking people who continue to support our mission as a Catholic school. Happy Birthday to NCHS – 50 great years of faith, tradition, and excellence!

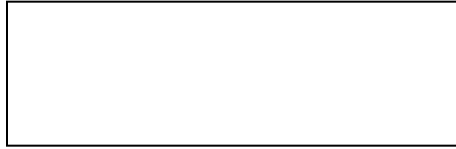

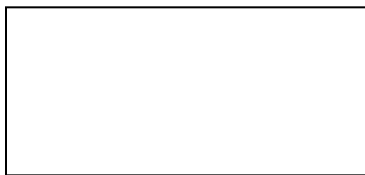

It is with great sadness that I write this article today. My heart is heavy since I learned of the death of my old friend and colleague, Sister Maria Arnold. Sister Maria and I worked together in the NC Library. I will always remember Sister Maria as a very patient teacher. The first day I met her we started talking like old friends and she took me under her wing showing me tricks of the trade, with only soft reprimands when I did something different than how she would have. My fondest memory is from my first year when both Sister Maria and Sister Hildegarde were volunteering in the library. I wasn’t feeling well, so Sister Hildegarde took over the library while Sister Maria took me to the convent and made me tea and toast. Never having been in a convent before, I was fascinated by my surroundings and grateful for the care I was being shown. Even after Sister Maria left, I would call her up and ask for advice.

She died on November 15, 2008, just days after my own father passed away. My dad’s death was a shock, which was then doubled when I found out at his funeral that her service was the next day. I regret not being able to go, but somehow I can see her smile with a “that’s okay, you do what you need to do”.

Please keep Sister Maria, my dad Carroll Davis, and all the faithful departed in your prayers tonight.

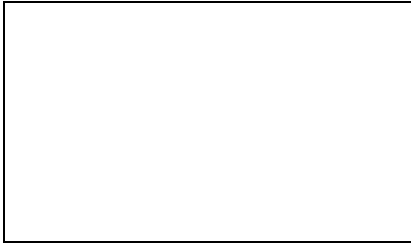

In post season play, the Green Wave beat Madison Christian 18-3, placing NC in the District Tourney against Worthington Christian. The ultimate goal is to play for the state title June 5-6 at the new Huntington Park in Columbus, home of the Columbus Clippers.

The Wave tourney roster has eight seniors – Garrett Clark, Sam Corl, Chris Leibold, Matt Lewis, Grant Marcelain, Cody Potts, Miles Richardson, and Andy Vernau. There are six juniors – Derek Adam, Nate Adams, Xavier Cook, Kevin Cox, Tony Guinta, and Jake Nelson; four sophomores – Michael Lewis, Cory Murphy, Sean Hughes, and Nate Taylor; and two freshmen – Jimmy Lough and Garrett Vernau.

Coach Cannizzaro ('70), Danny Mummey ('89), and Doug Stevens ('04), all NC grads, directed the varsity squad. Dave Riley ('62), Chris Grieb ('03), Dan Elwell ('86), along with Bob Hartless coached the reserve team. The reserves, comprised of five sophomores and eleven freshmen, sported an 8-13 record.

Special congratulations go to senior Luke Webster who received the Ernie Godfrey award from the Columbus Chapter of the National Football Foundation. This \$1,000 college scholarship is given to scholar athletes. Luke is only one of thirteen recipients in Central Ohio, and the only recipient in the Mid-State League. Way to go Luke!

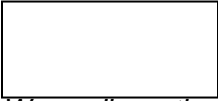

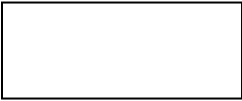
Mr. Ron Packard from Lifeline speaks about organ donation while sophomores hold lifelike organs.

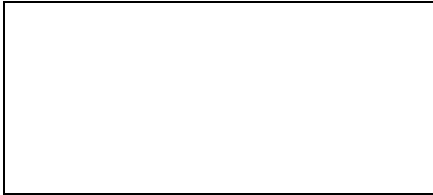
What will the Capital Campaign do?

10. It will ensure NC's place in Licking County for many years to come.

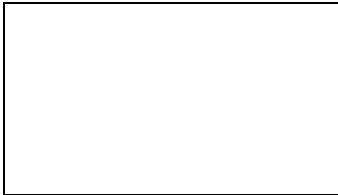
ART

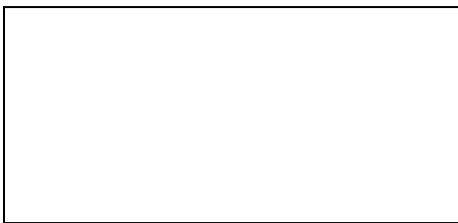
